"Thoughts From The Shepherds Scroll"



He answered them, 'When it is evening, you say, "It will evil? be fair weather, for the sky is red." And in the morning. "It will be stormy today, for the sky is red and threatening." You know how to interpret the appearance of the sky, but you cannot interpret the signs of the times. Matthew 16:2-3

At the time Jesus spoke these words, weather prediction was immediate for many centuries to come. Darkening clouds warned of a storm, and a southern wind called for scorching heat. There were no seven-day forecasts! Technology has brought us far from 'red sky at night, sailors delight!' It seems we have tamed nature, not that we can alter its course, but we can certainly plan around it. However, much of humanity's ability to interpret the signs of the times seems just as elusive today as when Jesus issued his warning.

Our Lord spoke to a crowd with a keen sense of nature but a dull sense of their spiritual situation. They were hardened against seeing that through Jesus, the kingdom of God had arrived and called on them to get their heads out of the clouds and repent, offering them the hope of reconciliation with God and each other. How times have not changed.

I have been unable to shake the sense of the tragedy of division that has intensified within our nation and the world. We will witness four more months of spiteful rhetoric before the election is complete, and I fear for the response it will elicit, no matter who is elected. Are we a nation that has forgotten the battle we are engaged in? The Apostle Paul, who knew the evil of persecution as the persecutor and the persecuted, shed light on the reality of humanity's battle with these words, "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world, and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms." Ephesians 6:12. Could it be feasible that our current self-inflicted rebellion is not founded on social-political disagreement but on a spiritual force of

As Jesus forewarned the world about the character of our opponent, "He was a murderer from the beginning, not holding to the truth, for there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies." John 8:44 So many of the world have been deceived into believing that Christianity has nothing to offer them. They wander about in the dark, absent of any moral authority above themselves, and feel free to exert their will against any who disagree with them. We are a nation founded on the freedom of speech, and there was a time when we were encouraged to exchange ideas and convictions in the town square of open dialog. The art of productive communication has been reduced to the anonymity of hiding behind a computer screen and subject to cancellation for not conforming to the popular narrative of the moment. The exchange of great truths is held captive by the evil of deceit and censorship.

It was the same world that brought lies and false witness against Jesus, a plan of deceit that gloriously backfired on Satan. The 'signs of the times' are brought into the light by those with eyes that see and ears that hear. An eternal truth made clear by the words of our Lord, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have abundantly." John 10:10

As faithful Christians, we possess abundant life here and now. We share in God's complete love as we nourish one another with words of comfort, peace, and joy. While the world may witness a great storm on the horizon, thanks be to God that we are empowered to see the eternal light which the cares of this world can never obstruct. I need to remember that truth.
